
The Cluster Fund is EUNIC's main internal scheme for financially supporting its network of clusters worldwide based on voluntary contributions from EUNIC members. Since 2012, it has funded over 200 cluster projects. It has proven to be a vital source of seed funding, strengthening collaboration among its members through clusters, kickstarting new initiatives and building lasting partnerships in the spirit of cultural relations. Over the 13 editions, Cluster Fund projects have evolved to become multi-dimensional, adding value to the local cultural scenes.

Out of the 47 applications submitted under the Cluster Fund 2023 call, 19 projects were selected and implemented throughout 2024. Building on EUNIC's commitment to sustainability, several of these projects addressed the optional topic of the 2023 call: climate action through culture.

This project promoted recycling and creativity while raising environmental awareness. The project empowered 88 participants from diverse backgrounds to transform waste into art through workshops combining theory and practice.

The workshops explored innovative approaches, including pinhole photography, eco-sculptures and floral art made with recycled materials.

The initiative culminated in a public exhibition which showcased the participants' creations and raised awareness about recycling and climate change.

Participants and educators amplified the project's impact through community engagement and social media.




european heritage days الد

European Heritage Days in Ankara, Türkiye, has grown significantly since its inception in 2022, evolving into a major cultural event.

The project included guided and city tours, exhibitions, concerts, and conferences, attracting around 3000 attendees. The event's success was advanced by a new website which streamlined event registration and communications, drawing 30,000 visitors. The project brought together 34 organisations, including eight European Embassies, Turkish cultural institutions, universities and local associations.

By uniting diverse partners and offering accessible heritage experiences, the European Heritage Days celebrated cultural richness and fostered collaboration. The initiative is set to become a lasting feature of Türkiye's cultural calendar with plans to expand in Istanbul and Izmir. Read more.

#FilmsForFuture documentary film festival for climate action art

The #FilmsForFuture festival brought together diverse audiences through screenings, workshops and discussions, in Zenica, Tuzla, and Sarajevo.

The event spotlighted the environmental challenges faced in the aftermath of war, such as air, soil, and water contamination, the exploitation of natural resources and waste disposal issues.

#FilmsForFuture aimed to foster creativity and collaboration, particularly among young people. The festival featured documentaries from various countries, followed by engaging Q&A sessions with filmmakers

The festival included hands-on workshops on ecoproject proposal writing, sustainability in daily life, Al's role in climate action and the creation of an eco-themed comic book. The workshops allowed students to pitch project proposals and three winning ideas receiving small-scale grants for implementation.

The Bulgaria cluster partnered with Arte Urbana Collectif to launch a project combining environmental education with the arts.

Engaging over 600 children, students, and adults, the programme spanned film screenings, storytelling workshops, and creative activities across Vidin, Troyan, Karpachevo, and Lovech.

The project unfolded in three stages: film screenings and debates, youth film camps, and the art and ecology days.

The project culminated in three exceptional short films which introduced fresh perspectives on local environmental challenges.

By equipping young people with filmmaking skills and fostering civic responsibility, See it, Say it, Film it! inspired a new generation to address environmental challenges through creativity. Read more.



The project explored the link between ecological, social, and cultural connectivity through four key themes: territorial connectivity, urban dynamics, dialogue with other life forms, and local cultural expressions. It focused on four urban-rural nodes in Bogotá, where artists and collectives engaged in site visits, environmental monitoring, and cultural exchanges at locations like the Eastern Hills, Bogotá River, Cerro Seco, and the Van der Hammen Reserve.

Insights from these visits informed co-creation and action labs, culminating in six artistic narratives on environmental rights, exhibited in at the Miguel Urrutia Art Museum and a community gathering.

In its second phase, the project expanded territorial installations and held a final exhibition with support from Colombia's Ministry of Culture and Bogotá's Secretary of Culture, Recreation and Sports.



eu street art meets hong kong: green for street

HKWALLS 2024 welcomed European street artists for this project, blending creativity and cultural exchange with a focus on climate change. The festival featured seven EU artists, alongside local and international muralists, with climate-themed murals across Hong Kong's central and western districts. Digital artworks by artists from Czechia, Germany, and France were also displayed on a hotel's LED screen.

Guided tours in English and Cantonese invited the public to explore the art and its impact. The programme included art talks and workshops, which allowed artists to share insights on street art's role in urban regeneration and environmental advocacy.

The initiative included the HKWALLS Art Community project, a collaboration with the EUNIC cluster, HK Baptist University and EU street artists. Together, they created a striking mural celebrating cultural exchange and creativity. Read more.




Museum forward: first edition of an international best practice forum on museums and heritage

Museum Forward in Jakarta brought together museum professionals from Indonesia and around the world. Organised in partnership with ICOM and supported by the EU Delegation, the event attracted over 700 participants.

The forum focused on the evolving role of museums, new narratives and inclusive practices, with experts from across Indonesia and international speakers sharing insights on sustainable museum practices and curatorial strategies. Activities also included museum visits, a public conference, and 14 capacity-building workshops.

The event fostered new partnerships between museums and cultural organisations, strengthening skills in museum management and risk management. Museum Forward will return in 2025. Read more.



The third edition of the Mombasa Ocean Festival brought together over 2800 participants to promote ocean conservation and awareness.

The festival engaged schools, scientists, and the public, particularly children, through activities such as inter-school competitions, workshops, exhibitions and performances carried out by local and international musicians.

The event also featured UNESCO Ocean Literacy courses for teachers, and concluded with "Blue Talks," a round table on integrating science into ocean-related policymaking.

The discussion involved key stakeholders and initiated consultations for Kenya's participation in the third United Nations Ocean Conference 2025 in Nice. Read more.

SustainARTability brought together 18 art students from across European countries for a 10-day residency at the Art Academy of Latvia. The project focused on sustainability and its challenges.

Art, design, and fashion students worked both individually and in groups to create artworks that reflected sustainability issues. A key component of the residency was the No White Flags exhibition, which reimagined the white flag to convey a message of resistance against environmental degradation. The artists created pieces using sustainable methods, some incorporating recycled materials, to promote awareness of resource conservation.

The project also featured workshops and lectures on sustainability and the role of art in climate action. The residency culminated in an exhibition, with plans for it to be displayed in Kuldīga Art House, Latvia, in 2025. Read more.

□ nomad spirit: raising climate awareness through art in mongolia

Organised in collaboration with the Mongolian Contemporary Art Support Association and European cultural institutions, the project focused on addressing climate change through contemporary art.

Held in Deren Soum - an area in Mongolia severely affected by water scarcity and habitat loss - the initiative engaged over 260 participants, including artists from Europe and Mongolia.

Nomad Spirit featured a series of workshops, sitespecific art installations and community exhibitions. The project highlighted sustainable artistic practices and fostered cultural exchange.

Nomad Spirit offered a compelling example of how art can be a powerful tool for raising climate awareness and inspiring ecological action. Plans for future iterations aim to expand the project's impact further.



sā Ladakh - edition two was held in the remote Himalayan desert, 3600 meters above sea level, and focused on fostering sustainable transboundary engagements through regenerative land art.

The event featured site-specific installations, sculptures and dynamic programmes created using locally sourced, discarded, renewable, or reusable materials. These artworks highlighted the region's commitment to sustainability.

The event engaged people from all walks of life, especially young adults, to inspire climate optimism through art. The core values of sā Ladakh centred on creating regenerative art made from recyclable or biodegradable materials that do not negatively impact the environment.

The project was a platform for raising awareness about climate solutions on both local and international levels. Read more.




hew york garden of collective futures mural





Cortolabs empowered audiovisual professionals in underrepresented regions of Peru, using film to explore the climate crisis and promote ecological awareness.

Through an open call, ten projects were selected for a six-month programme, culminating in Mama Qocha, a short film that received funding as the winning project.

Blending online and in-person workshops, masterclasses, and hands-on sessions, Cortolabs guided participants through filmmaking while fostering cross-cultural collaboration between European and Peruvian professionals.

By connecting emerging filmmakers from remote areas with industry experts, the programme strengthened Peruvian cinema and highlighted the power of audiovisual storytelling in addressing climate challenges. Read more.




괴 flowing streams: a cultural exploration of water in rural romania

This multi-residency project explored the cultural ecology of water in diverse rural locations across Romania.

Seven artists were selected, each hosted by a local organisation near unique bodies of water, including mineral springs, salt lakes, mountain rivers and the Danube River.

Acting as cartographers, the residents mapped social and cultural imbalances affecting water relations. The project culminated in a publication featuring first-person accounts, images and insights from the residencies, and 500 copies were distributed during launch events in Timişoara and Bucharest.

The project inspired Waters of In-betweenness, an exhibition which took place at the House of European Institutes (HEI) in Timişoara. Read more.

Saudi arabia the great heat december 2024







the great heat

Saudi Arabia faces urgent environmental challenges. As part of Vision 2030, the country has undergone a process of rapid technological and social modernisation, aligned with the UN SDGs and the Saudi Green Initiative. However, public awareness of environmental issues remain limited.

EUNIC Saudi Arabia proposed The Great Heat - a series of debates addressing these issues. The project culminated in a three-day conference during COP16 in Riyadh, organised with Saudi NGO AEON. The event explored the role of artists, cultural professionals, and institutions in responding to biodiversity loss, desertification, and resource depletion. The conference featured a workshop led by Saudi and European experts, exploring international best practices. Its outcomes contributed to the development of a charter for cultural organisations committed to environmental action.

Urban Oases revitalised neglected urban spaces in Belgrade through art, sustainability and community engagement.

In collaboration with local and international partners, the project transformed three locations into vibrant, inclusive spaces. Students, experts, and residents codesigned interventions, creating outdoor amenities, ecological education areas, and cultural hubs.

The project was showcased at the Belgrade International Architecture Week, featuring workshops, performances, and community activities.

Now active centres for cultural and social engagement, these spaces demonstrated the power of collective action in urban transformation. The initiative created a model for sustainable development, inspiring similar efforts across the city. Read more.


In collaboration with Good Life X, this project focused on sustainable and symbiotic creative practices that address environmental challenges.

A digital map that plotted over 170 innovative industries across Sri Lanka was created to promote an ecological transition through sustainable fashion, inventive technologies, and community-focused solutions.

An exhibition in Colombo featuring 10 standout creatives attracted hundreds of visitors, with live performances, interactive workshops and open studio tours that allowed attendees to witness the production processes.

The Routes We Take highlighted Sri Lanka's creative talent and established a platform for collaboration among artists, institutions and policymakers.



A testament to Ukraine's vital cultural heritage during a time of conflict, the festival featured 12 events that paid tribute to Ukrainian artists who lost their lives in the war. Each day, the festival honoured different Ukrainian figures. The programme blended traditional works with innovative artistic interpretations.

The festival's impact extended beyond these tributes, as it involved cultural exchange, with performances that fused Ukrainian culture with those of other European nations.

Performances included the Polish opera soloists performing Ukrainian composers and the Austrian Benjamin Schmid Jazz Quartet's interpretation of a Ukrainian Iullaby.

The festival fosters a deep and enduring connection between Ukraine and the rest of Europe and is expected to return in 2025. Read more.

The project united European and Thai cultural practitioners to promote sustainability and climate action in Thailand's cultural sector.

A two-day conference addressed the ecological impact of cultural events and culture's potential to drive climate action. The conference provided a platform for knowledge exchange, gathering festival organisers, sustainability experts and policymakers from Europe and Thailand to discuss sustainable event management and the development of practical tools to promote climate action within the creative industries.

A toolkit was created, providing event organisers valuable guidance for reducing the environmental impact of festivals and events.

The project highlighted the importance of collaboration, intersectionality, and a unified approach to sustainability. Read more.
